The facility will start receiving inmates as of the 1 st July 2020 – 90 a week from all over the state.	Glen Scholes & Bree Hiatt
		The centre will house its own medical team of doctors and nursers, enabling smaller procedures to be undertaking within centre freeing up the hospital system.
