FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

All Clarence residents, not-for-profit community groups, schools or businesses in the Clarence Valley Council (CVC) area at the time of nomination.

HOW CAN I BE NOMINATED?

By a third party or you can self-nominate.

WHEN DO NOMINATIONS OPEN?

Nominations open during May and close during August each year. Nomination forms are available from the CVC website and the Grafton and Maclean Council offices. All nominees are recognised at a community celebration during October.

HOW DO I NOMINATE?

Nomination forms are available from the CVC website and the Grafton and Maclean Council offices. You may also use audio visual means to nominate.

WHO JUDGES THE AWARDS?

CVC's Climate Change advisory committee judges the awards.
