Could a plan achieve a switchback ramp etc without it having to go through all that vegetation?</li> <li>Cr Karen Toms –This project needs to become a priority because it's about accessibly. Would hate for this project to take a long time.</li> <li>Motion – Advise Council to consider future budget allocation for design work for the Turners Beach access.</li> <li>Moved Cr Karen Toms</li> <li>Second Laura Smith-Khan</li> </ul>	Action – Cr Toms and Cr Pickering to bring this project up at Council workshop to have this project considered for Council's forward works program.



	<ul> <li>Kate Begbie – there is a beach wheelchair kept at the Calypso Caravan Park in Yamba. Is there space in the plan/budget to have a lock up area at the amenities block to have the wheelchair there.</li> <li>Kate Begbie asked whether access to beach wheelchair can be improved at Brooms Head as well. It's kept at the amenities block at Brooms Head. Minnie Water was also mentioned.</li> <li>Recommendation – Explore the options of having the beach wheelchair available in a lock up area at the amenities block near Turners Beach with an MLAC Key.</li> <li>Moved – Kate Begbie</li> <li>Second – Laura Smith-Khan</li> </ul>	Action – Erin Brady to ask open spaces if any possibility for beach wheelchair to be kept at Turners Beach toilet bock. Action – Erin Brady to investigate beach wheelchair locations, access and ownership - Turners, Minnie Brooms, Woody Head.
Access at a Glance	<ul> <li>Jason Kingsley – gave a brief overview of the Access at a Glance project.</li> <li>Jason Kingsley delivers the Access at a Glance project through his role at Social Futures.</li> <li>The Access Committee report to Council's September meeting was not included in Business Papers. Feedback was Council's endorsement of the project and Council's participation in the project was operational and didn't need to be approved by the Council.</li> <li>Jason Kinglsey said Social Futures provide the stickers for free.</li> <li>Dave Moran was involved last time the Access Committee promoted the program. In his experience Dave Moran said many shops/business owners had no idea that these access issues existed until they told them about it.</li> <li>Jason Kingsley said following promotion of the Access at a Glance project, he could approach places like Shoppingworld to talk about access, implementing Access at a Glance and have conversations about access for assistance dogs in training.</li> <li>Access at a Glance could be promoted to the CV Chamber of Commerce groups and CVC Economic Development team to promote through networks.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>CVC to work with Jason Kingsley from Social Futures on implementing Access at a Glance at council's main public buildings and promoting through CVC communications channels.</li> <li>Social Futures and Access Committee to make a plan to visit CV businesses in villages and towns to encourage them to join the Access at a Glance program.</li> </ul>



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	<ul> <li>Jason Kingsley said the program could be woven into CVC Vibrant Places to create awareness of access. Shoreline was mentioned.</li> <li>Cr Karen Toms said access for all abilities required constant education</li> <li>Jason Kingsley said a good way to promote the Access at a Glance project was to pitch to businesses that 20% of population have a disability. If businesses are accessible, they attract business from not only people living with a disability, but their family members and friends. 90% of those with a disability have a disability that can't be seen.</li> <li>Zoe Goodsell – access affects more people than only person's living with a disability – it's prams, people with oxygen tanks etc</li> <li>Kate Begbie – this could be an ongoing project for the Access Committee. Perhaps one time per year where we go out and promote it – and getting feedback. Potentially a space in calendar where we can dedicate time to promote this.</li> <li>Council used to promote International Day of People with Disability (IDPwD).</li> <li>Cr Karon Toms - Keep this item as an agenda item. So we don't forget about it.</li> <li>Cr Steve Pickering – Arts NSW had an access officer. Should Council have this? Council no longer has a permanent position for an aged and disability project officer.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Keep Access at a Glance as an ongoing agenda item</li> </ul>

	would lose one car parking space. Could have 1-2 motor bike spaces? A new	
	space in River Street needs to be to current standard which is difficult with	
	width of road.	
	Bevan Sommerlad – Disputes argument that accessible parking would	
	encroach on footpath. Shops in the area have things on the footpath on both	
	sides. Bevan Sommerlad thinks it is far more important to have accessible	
	parking than tables and chairs on the footpath. Been pushing it 4-5 years.	
	Lost accessible parking spaces out the back of main street when IGA took	
	over.	
	• Cr Karen Toms – Her understanding is what Bevan Sommerlad wants is to cut	
	into footpath to get width for accessible parking in River Street.	
	• Kate Begbie - Do we need to shift focus onto the bigger carpark out the back	
	of main street – make parking closer to arcades making it easier and safer to	
	get through to main street. Put in accessible parking closer to facilities.	
	Carney's Arcade is easier to get through with wheelchair than the bread shop	
	arcade - not easy to get through.	
	<ul> <li>Cr Karen Toms – IGA carpark is owned by IGA.</li> </ul>

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<ul> <li>Ross McCann – there are a sufficient number of accessible carparks in Maclean. There are double what a DA would ask.</li> <li>We're talking about location. River Street doesn't lend itself to accessible car parking spaces. The restriction is the footpath – height and width. A compliant ramp would have to go from gutter line to shop front. 1 in 14 grade is not achievable in that environment.</li> <li>Cr Karen Toms – what I'm hearing from professional staff – it's not compliant.</li> </ul>
